The Yellow-fronted Canary is native to sub-Saharan Africa and is a popular and hardy cage bird (Vriends 1984). Scattered individuals and pairs have been reported over the years in the Miami area (M. Wheeler, pers. commun.), but no evidence of feral breeding is known. Males sing from the tops of tall trees, and during the At period a male was heard repeatedly at a site south of Miami (block 1 of the Perrine quadrangle) by K. Rist. Although listed as a "probable," we still have no reason to believe breeding has occurred in Florida outside of captivity.
