**SPECIFIC DESCRIPTIONS OF ALLIGATOR MANAGEMENT UNITS**  
**2009**

**Management Unit #101: Lake Pierce**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Pierce in Polk County, within Townships 28S and 29S and Range 28E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #102: Lake Marian**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Marian in Osceola County, within Township 30S and Ranges 32E and 33E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #103: Kissimmee River (Pool E)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Kissimmee River and C38 Canal (Pool E) in Okeechobee and Highlands Counties; within township 36S and 37S and ranges 33E and 34E; north from the S65E structure, located 1.5 miles south of SR 70, approximately 7 miles to the S65D structure, located 3 miles south of US Hwy. 98; and excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #104: Lake Hatchineha**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Hatchineha in Polk and Osceola counties, within Townships 28S and 29S and Ranges 29E and 30E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway except as follows: south down the Kissimmee River Canal (C37) approximately one mile to the Zipperer Bridge, south of Camp Lester.

**Management Unit #105: Kissimmee River (Pool A)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Kissimmee River and C38 Canal (Pool A) in Osceola and Polk counties, within Townships 31S and 32S and Ranges 31E and 32E, south from the S65 structure, located on SR 60, approximately 11 miles to the S65A structure, located 21 miles north of US Hwy. 98; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #106: Kissimmee River**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Kissimmee River and C38 Canal (Pool B & C) in Polk, Osceola, Highlands, and Okeechobee counties; within Townships 32S, 33S, 34S and 35S and Ranges 31E and 32E; north from the S65C structure, located 1.5 miles north of US Hwy. 98, approximately 20 miles to the S65A structure, located 11 miles south of SR 60, and including the Istokpoga Canal approximately 4.3 miles west to the CR 621 Bridge; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #108: Lake Arbuckle**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Arbuckle in Polk County; within Township 32S and Ranges 29E and 30E; north of CR 64 and west of Avon Park Bombing Range; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #109: Lake Istokpoga**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Istokpoga in Highlands County; within Townships 35S and 36S and Ranges 30E and 31E; south of US Hwy. 98, north and west of CR 621, east of US Hwy. 27; north up Arbuckle Creek approximately one mile to US Hwy. 98; east on the Istokpoga Canal approximately 1.5 miles to CR 621; and excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #110: Lake Kissimmee**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Kissimmee in Polk and Osceola counties; within Townships 29S, 30S, and 31S and Ranges 30E and 31E; north of the S65 structure located immediately south of SR 60; and south of the Zipperer Bridge located approximately 1.7 miles up the Kissimmee River Canal (C37); excluding Tiger Creek, the Lake Kissimmee State Park access canal, the portion of the lake within 1/4 mile of the emergent vegetation bordering the lake shore between the Kissimmee River Canal (C37) and Tiger Creek (or that area otherwise known as Tiger Cove), and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #112: Tenoroc Fish Management Area**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of lakes B and 5 on Tenoroc Fish Management Area in Polk County, within townships 27S and 28S and ranges 24E and 25E.

### **Management Unit #115: Lake Weohyakapka**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Weohyakapka in Polk County; within Townships 30S and 31S and Range 29E, south of SR 60 and north of SR 630; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #116: Cypress Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Cypress Lake in Osceola County; within Townships 27S and 28S and Range 30E, west of CR 523; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #117: Lake Parker**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Parker, Lake Crago, and the Lake Crago canal in Polk County; within Townships 27S and 28S and Range 24E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #118: Lake Manatee**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Manatee in Manatee County; within Townships 34S and 35S and Ranges 19E and 20E; east of the Lake Manatee Dam, west of Verna-Bethany Road, and south of CR 675; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #119: Peace River North**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Peace River in De Soto, Hardee, and Polk counties; within Townships 30S, 31S, 32S, 33S, 34S, 35S, 36S and 37S and Ranges 24E and 25E; north of SR 70 and south of SR 60; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #120: Peace River South**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Peace River in De Soto and Charlotte counties; within Townships 37S, 38S, 39S and 40S and Ranges 23E and 24E; south of SR 70 and east of I-75, and including Shell Creek west of US Hwy. 17; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #121: Caloosahatchee River**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Caloosahatchee River in Glades, Hendry, and Lee counties; within Townships 42S and 43S and Ranges 26E, 27E, 28E, 29E and 30E; west of the S78 structure (Ortona Lock) and east of the S79 structure (Franklin Lock), excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #303: Lake Miccosukee**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Miccosukee in Jefferson and Leon counties, within Townships 2N and 3N and Ranges 3E and 4E, and north of US Hwy. 90; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #306: Wacissa River**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Wacissa River in Jefferson County, within Townships 2S and 3S and Ranges 3E and 4E, from Goose Pasture north to SR 59; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #402: Everglades & Francis S. Taylor Wildlife Management Area (WCAs 2A & 2B)**

The state-owned or leased lands located within the boundaries of the Everglades and Francis S. Taylor Wildlife Management Area in Broward and Palm Beach counties, within Townships 46S, 47S, 48S, 49S, and 50S and Ranges 38E, 39E, and 40E, and otherwise known as Water Conservation Areas 2A and 2B.

**Management Unit #404: Everglades & Francis S. Taylor Wildlife Management Area (WCAs 3A & 3B)**

The state-owned or leased lands located within the boundaries of the Everglades and Francis S. Taylor Wildlife Management Area in Broward and Dade counties, within Townships 47S, 48S, 49S, 50S, 51S, 52S, 53S, and 54S and Ranges 35E, 36E, 37E, 38E, and 39E, and otherwise known as Water Conservation Areas 3A and 3B.

**Management Unit #405: Holey Land Wildlife Management Area**

The state-owned or leased lands located within the boundaries of the Holey Land Wildlife Management Area in Palm Beach County, within Townships 47S and 48S and Ranges 36E and 37E.

**Management Unit #406: STA-5**

The South Florida Water Management District lands known as Stormwater Treatment Area 5 (STA-5) in Hendry County; within Townships 46S and 47S and Range 34E.

**Management Unit #407: STA-1W North**

The South Florida Water Management District lands known as Stormwater Treatment Area 1W North (STA-1W North) in Palm Beach County; including cells 5A and 5B only; within Township 44S and Ranges 39E and 40E.

**Management Unit #408: STA-1W South**

The South Florida Water Management District lands known as Stormwater Treatment Area 1W South (STA-1W South) in Palm Beach County; including cells 1B, 2B, and 4 only; within Township 44S and Ranges 39E and 40E.

**Management Unit #409: Lake Hicpochee**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Hicpochee and that portion of the Caloosahatchee River Canal (C43) from the S77 structure at Moore Haven west to the S78 structure at Ortona in Glades County, within Township 42S and Ranges 30E, 31E, and 32E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #500: Blue Cypress Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Blue Cypress Lake in Indian River County, within Townships 31S and 32S and Range 36E, north of SR 60; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #501: St. Johns River (Lake Hell N' Blazes)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Brevard County, within Townships 28S and 29S and Ranges 35E and 36E, south of US Hwy. 192 to the south end of Lake Hell N' Blazes, and including Lakes Sawgrass, Little Sawgrass, and Hell N' Blazes; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #502: St. Johns River (Lake Poinsett)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Brevard, Osceola, and Orange counties; within Townships 24S, 25S, 26S and 27S and Ranges 34E, 35E, and 36E; north of US Hwy. 192 and south of SR 520; and including Lakes Washington, Winder, and Poinsett; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #504: St. Johns River (Puzzle Lake)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Brevard, Orange, Seminole, and Volusia counties; within Townships 20S, 21S, and 22S and Ranges 33E and 34E; north of SR 50 and south of SR 46; and including Lakes Cone, Ruth, Clark, and Puzzle; excluding Lakes Ellis, Loughman, Silver, and Salt, the St. Johns National Wildlife Refuge, Seminole Ranch Wildlife Management Area, and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #505: Lake Harney**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Seminole and Volusia counties; within Townships 19S and 20S and Ranges 31E, 32E, and 33E; north of SR 46 and east of SR 415; and including Lake Harney and Thornhill and Mud lakes; excluding Mullet Lake and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #506: St. Johns River (Welaka)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Putnam County; within Townships 10S, 11S, 12S, and 13S and Ranges 25E and 26E; north of an east-west line across the St. Johns River at Black Point and south of the Seaboard Coast Line railroad bridge; and including Trout Creek; excluding the Florida Barge Canal and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #507: St. Johns River (Palatka South)**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Putnam County; within Townships 10S and 11S and Ranges 26E and 27E; south of US Hwy. 17 and north of the Seaboard Coast Line railroad bridge; and including Murphy and Dunns Creek; excluding Dunns Creek east of US Hwy. 17 and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #508: Crescent Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Crescent Lake in Putnam and Flagler counties; within Townships 11S, 12S, and 13S and Ranges 27E and 28E; and including Dead Lake; excluding Dunns Creek, Haw Creek, and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #509: Lake Griffin**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Griffin and the Ocklawaha River in Lake and Marion Counties; within Townships 17S, 18S, 19S, and Ranges 24E and 25E; south of CR 42; excluding Lake Griffin State Recreation Area, the waters north and west of the CR 466A bridge, and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #510: Lake Jesup**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Jesup in Seminole County, within Township 20S and Ranges 30E and 31E, and south of SR 46; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #515: Lake Panasoffkee**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Panasoffkee in Sumter County, within Townships 19S and 20S and Range 22E; excluding Outlet River and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #516: Withlacoochee River North**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the Withlacoochee River in Citrus, Marion, and Sumter counties; within Townships 17S, 18S, and 19S and Ranges 20E and 21E; north of SR 44 and south of SR 200; excluding Lake Tsala Apopka, Henderson Lake, and the Hernando Pool and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #518: Lake Rousseau**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Rousseau in Citrus, Levy, and Marion counties; within Townships 16S and 17S and Ranges 17E and 18E, and west of US Hwy. 41; and including the Florida Barge Canal from Lake Rousseau to the Inglis Lock; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #520: Lake Tohopekaliga**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Tohopekaliga in Osceola County; within Townships 25S, 26S, and 27S and Ranges 29E and 30E; and south of CR 525; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #527: Lake Monroe**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Volusia and Seminole counties; within Township 19S and Ranges 30E and 31E; east of I-4 and west of CR 415; and including Lake Monroe; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #528: Lake Dexter**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of the St. Johns River in Volusia and Lake counties; within Townships 15S and 16S and Ranges 28E; south of SR 40 and north of Channel Marker 15 on the St. Johns River; and including that portion of Lake Dexter west of a north-south line extending from the mouth of Eph Creek; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #540: St. Johns River Upper Basin Canals**

The St. Johns River Water Management District lands in Brevard and Indian River counties; within Townships 29S, 30S, 31S, and 32S and Ranges 35E and 36E; including only the C-40 canal, the canal running eastward from the C-40 canal to the willow shelter, the double parallel canals running eastward from the C-40 canal along the northern boundary of the Mary A Water Management Area, and the canal west and south of the L-76 levee between the S-96C structure and the airboat levee crossing at the northwest corner of the Blue Cypress Water Management Area; excluding the canal along the L-74W levee and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #542: Blue Cypress Water Management Area**

The St. Johns River Water Management District land known as the Blue Cypress Water Management Area in Indian River County; within Townships 31S, 32S, and 33S and Ranges 36E and 37E; west and south of the L-75 levee, north of SR 60, and east of the L-76 levee; and including the canal between the L-76 and L-75 levees from the northwest corner of Blue Cypress Water Management Area to the S-96D structure; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #543: T.M. Goodwin Waterfowl Management Area (Broadmoor Unit)**

The Broadmoor Unit of the St. Johns River Water Management District land known as the T.M. Goodwin Waterfowl Management Area in Brevard county; within Township 30S and Range 36E; excluding the Goodwin Unit and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #544: Stick Marsh**

The St. Johns River Water Management District land known as the Stick Marsh in Indian River County; within Township 31S and Range 36E; west of the L-75 levee, north and east of the L-76 levee, and south of the levee north of C-54 canal between the S-96 and S-96B structures; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #545: Kenansville Lake**

The St. Johns River Water Management District land known as Kenansville Lake in Indian River County; within Township 31S and Ranges 35E and 36E; excluding the canal along the LB74W levee east of Kenansville Lake and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #546: T.M. Goodwin Waterfowl Management Area (Goodwin Unit)**

The Goodwin Unit of the St. Johns River Water Management District land known as the T.M. Goodwin Waterfowl Management Area in Brevard county; within Township 30S and Range 36E; excluding the Broadmoor Unit and more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #547: Guana River Wildlife Management Area**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Ponte Vedra on Guana River Wildlife Management Area in St. Johns County; within Townships 4S and 5S and Ranges 29E and 30E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #548: Ocala Wildlife Management Area**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Eaton, Juniper Creek beginning at a point 50 yards west of the mouth at Lake George to a point 50 yards east of the SR 19 bridge, and Salt Springs Run beginning at a point 50 yards west of the mouth at Lake George to the Salt Springs boat ramp on Ocala Wildlife Management Area in Marion and Lake counties; within Townships 14 S and 15S and Ranges 24E, 26E, and 27E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #549: Three Lakes Wildlife Management Area**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Jackson on Three Lakes Wildlife Management Area in Osceola County; within Townships 29S and 30S and Ranges 31E and 32E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

**Management Unit #601: Lake Okeechobee (West)**

The state-owned waters located within the rim canal and water line of Lake Okeechobee in Hendry, Glades, Okeechobee, Martin, and Palm Beach counties; within Townships 39S, 40S, 41S, 42S and 43S and Ranges 32E, 33E, 34E and 35E; east of SR 720, US Hwy. 27, and SR 78; northwest of a line extending northeast from the center line of the Clewiston Lock Canal; southwest of a line extending southeast from the center line of the Indian Prairie Canal; the C40 (Indian Prairie) Canal from the SR 78 bridge approximately 2.5 miles northwest to the S72 structure; the C41 (Harney Pond) Canal from the SR 78 bridge approximately two miles north to the S71 structure; and east of the SR 78 bridge on the Sportsman Village Canal. Specific access sites may be designated for this management unit.

**Management Unit #602: Lake Okeechobee (North)**

The state-owned waters located within the rim canal and water line of Lake Okeechobee in Glades, Okeechobee, Martin, and Palm Beach counties; within Townships 37S, 38S, 39S, 40S, and 41S and Ranges 34E and 35E; northeast of a line extending southeast from the center line of the Indian Prairie Canal; east of SR 78; the C40 (Indian Prairie) Canal from the SR 78 bridge approximately 2.5 miles northwest to the S72 structure; south of US Hwy. 441; west of a line extending south from the center line of the Taylor Creek Lock Canal; the C38 Canal extending northwest from the SR 78 bridge approximately eight miles to the S65E structure; and the C41A canal beginning adjacent to the S65E structure west approximately

one mile to the S84 structure; excluding that portion of the rim canal known as Eagle Bay, between the Lock 7 Bridge at the intersection of US Hwy. 441 and SR 78 to the Hoover Dyke Road. Specific access sites may be designated for this management unit.

#### **Management Unit #603: Lake Okeechobee (East)**

The state-owned waters located within the rim canal and the water line of Lake Okeechobee in Okeechobee, Martin, and Palm Beach counties; within Townships 37S, 38S, 39S, 40S, and 41S and Ranges 35E, 36E, and 37E; east of a line extending south from the center line of the Taylor Creek Lock Canal; south and west of US Hwy. 441; and northeast of a line extending northwest from the West Palm Beach Canal. Specific access sites may be designated for this management unit.

#### **Management Unit #604: Lake Okeechobee (South)**

The state-owned waters located within the lake levee and the water line of Lake Okeechobee in Palm Beach and Hendry counties; within Townships 41S, 42S, and 43S and Ranges 34E, 35E, 36E, and 37E; southwest of a line extending northwest from the West Palm Beach Canal; west of SR 715; north and east of US Hwy. 27; and southeast of a line extending northeast from the center line of the Clewiston Lock Canal. Specific access sites may be designated for this management unit.

#### **Management Unit #711: Lake Hancock**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Hancock in Polk County, within Townships 28S and 29S and Ranges 24E and 25E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway except as follows: south down Saddle Creek approximately 0.7 miles to the water control structure.

#### **Management Unit #721: Rodman Reservoir**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Rodman Reservoir (Lake Ocklawaha) and the Ocklawaha River in Marion and Putnam counties; within Townships 11S, 12S, and 13S and Ranges 24E and 25E; from Eureka Dam north to Kirkpatrick Dam; east and south of CR 315; south of CR 310; and including the Florida Barge Canal from Rodman Reservoir to the SR 19 bridge; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

#### **Management Unit #722: Orange Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Orange Lake in Alachua and Marion counties, within townships 11S and 12S and ranges 21E and 22E, and west of US Hwy. 301; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

#### **Management Unit #723: Lochloosa Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lochloosa Lake in Alachua County, within Township 11S and Ranges 21E and 22E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #724: Newnans Lake**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Newnans Lake in Alachua County, within townships 9S and 10S and ranges 20E and 21E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #732: Lake Iamonia**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Iamonia in Leon County, within township 3N and ranges 1W, 1E, and 2E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #733: Lake Talquin**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Talquin in Gadsden and Leon counties; within Townships 1S and 1N and Ranges 2W, 3W and 4W; north of the Jackson Bluff Dam; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway except as follows: including that portion of the Ochlockonee River lying between Lake Talquin and the railroad trestle that is located immediately below U.S. Highway 90, and those portions of natural waterways lying between Lake Talquin and named roads more specifically described in Rule 68A-23.005 (7)(d), F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #734: Lake Seminole**

The state- and federally-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Seminole in Jackson County; west of the boundary between Florida and Georgia and within the jurisdiction of the State of Florida; within Townships 4N, 5N, 6N, and 7N and Ranges 6W, 7W, and 8W; south of SR 2; north of the Jim Woodruff Dam; east of SR 271; and including those waters of Lake Seminole in the Apalachee Wildlife Management Area; excluding all Lake Seminole waters east of the boundary between Florida and Georgia and all waters under the jurisdiction of the State of Georgia.

### **Management Unit #741: Lake Trafford**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake Trafford in Collier County, within Townships 46S and 47S and Range 28E; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #751: Lake George**

The state-owned waters located within the water line of Lake George in Volusia and Putnam counties; within Townships 13S, 14S, and 15S and Ranges 26E and 27E; south of an east-west line across the St. Johns River at Black Point; and north of an east-west line extending from Zinder Point to the east bank; excluding more than 50 yards up any connecting natural or manmade waterway.

### **Management Unit #801: Alachua County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Alachua County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: Orange, Newnans, and Lochloosa lakes; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #802: Baker County**

This management unit does not include: the Peace River south of SR 60; the Kissimmee River south of the Zipperer Bridge and that portion south of SR 60; lakes Pierce, Hatchineha, Kissimmee, Hancock, Parker, Weohyakapka, and Arbuckle; Teneroc Fish Management Area; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #854: Putnam County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Putnam County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: the St. Johns River south of US Hwy. 17; Murphy and Trout creeks; Dunns

Creek west of US Hwy. 17; Lake George; Crescent Lake; Florida Barge Canal west of SR 19; Rodman Reservoir; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #855: Santa Rosa County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Santa Rosa County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #856: Sarasota County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Sarasota County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, excluding: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #857: Seminole County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Seminole County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: the St. Johns River east of I-4; lakes Monroe, Jesup, and Harney; Puzzle Lake; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #858: St. Johns County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within St. Johns County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: Guana River Wildlife Management Area; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #859: St. Lucie County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within St. Lucie County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access

has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, excluding: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #860: Sumter County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Sumter County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: the Withlacoochee River north of SR 44; Lake Panasoffkee; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #861: Suwannee County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Suwannee County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #862: Taylor County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Taylor County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including the Hickory Mound, Spring Creek, Tide Swamp, and Snipe Island Units of the Big Bend Wildlife Management Area and the Aucilla Wildlife Management Area (subject to area specific access restrictions), and including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

#### **Management Unit #863: Union County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Union County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #864: Volusia County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Volusia County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: the St. Johns River south of SR 40 and north of Channel Marker 15 and that portion east of I-4; Lake George north of an east-west line from Zinder Point to the east bank; lakes Woodruff, Dexter, Monroe, and Harney; Thornhill, Mud, and Puzzle lakes; all waters within the Lake Woodruff National Wildlife Refuge including Tick Island Creek, Tick Island Mud Lake, Eph Creek, Harry's Creek, Honey Creek, Scoggin Creek, Norris Dead River, Zeigler Dead River, Spring Garden Creek, and Spring Garden Lake; within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #865: Wakulla County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Wakulla County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #866: Walton County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Walton County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

### **Management Unit #867: Washington County**

The state- and privately-owned waters and wetlands located within Washington County outside of incorporated cities and municipalities that have public access or for which access has been granted for the purpose of harvesting alligators under this permit, including contiguous state-owned waters that cross the county boundary. This management unit does not include: within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C.

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
